Call for Proposals:

Brick Bay Sculpture Trust invites proposals for large-scale projects and installations that explore contemporary interpretations of the architectural folly, a design build project leading to a two year exhibition at Brick Bay.

Especially popular among the Romantics of the 18th and 19th centuries, architectural follies are structures that often have no discernible purpose and are placed within a garden or landscape.

The objective is to support young and emerging New Zealand architects or students in an accredited New Zealand architecture programme, to explore the intersections between architecture and sculpture, and the increasing overlaps in references, concepts, and techniques between the two disciplines.

Award and Exhibition:

One conceptual project will be selected as the paramount winner.

The successful recipient will receive an overall \$30,000 grant towards realising the proposed project. This grant consists of three separate components:

- 1. \$15,000 cash from Resene to be applied towards the project plus Resene paint will be supplied in addition to this for the build supplied by New Zealand's leading paint and coatings company.
- 2. \$10,000 cash for Fletchers building supplies from Fletcher Building.
- 3. A non cash grant of up to \$5,000 of value for labour from Brick Bay Sculpture Trust.

The finished project will be installed and exhibited on the Brick Bay Sculpture Trail beginning early March 2017 for a period of twenty four months. The project will be documented by one of New Zealand's leading architectural photographer's, Samuel Hartnett.

AGM publishing will publish the Brick Bay Folly in Architectural New Zealand, Architecture Now and Urbis. The top five finalists will also be invited to create a scaled maquette/ model if they wish, to be included in the prestigious Urbis Design Day HQ exhibition.

Eligibility:

The Brick Bay Folly 2018 is open to all architects, recent graduates and students currently enrolled in an accredited undergraduate, postgraduate or doctoral level architectural programme at any New Zealand tertiary institution.

(this includes international students who are currently enrolled in a New Zealand institution)

Applicants must be no older than 35 years of age as at the 31st March 2018.

<u>Submission Requirement and Process:</u>

The Brick Bay Folly 2018 selection process is competitive. A jury of architects, artists, academics, arts administrators, building and paint experts, engineers and previous Folly winners will select one exceptional project to be realised within the grounds of Brick Bay Sculpture Trail.

The designated site for the selected Folly is adjacent to the Glass House, on the far side of a large pond. The site is where the second Folly winner, 'Daughter of The Swamp' is currently sited. Sited on a relatively flat to gently sloping site, the applicants must take into account the contour. Please refer to site survey information on page 6.

It is strongly recommended that you come and visit Brick Bay for a site reccy.

Applicants must take into account the public outdoor environment and be aware that the winning installation must meet safety requirements and be able to withstand weather and public interaction for the two year exhibition period. Conceptually, the Folly must have an emphasis on sustainability, use of colour/s (from a Resene standard colour reference chart), and a strong focus on prefabrication which can be constructed offsite.

Ownership:

Brick Bay Sculpture Trust will take and maintain ownership of the Folly on completion and will be responsible for de-installation, by any means it sees fit, at the end of the two year period. Brick Bay Sculpture Trust also reserve the right to sell the work.

Guidelines and Criteria:

Proposals must include the following components, which must be formatted as instructed below and emailed to <u>folly@brickbay.co.nz</u>

Cover sheet:

Applicant/s must include a separate cover sheet with name, mailing address, telephone number, email, project title. If you are applying as a team, please include the names and emails for each team member and identify one team member as the Lead Contact.

The CV of each participant should include information about all education; work and teaching experience, awards and other relevant information.

Project Proposal:

Applicants must submit a project proposal of up to 1,000 words that clearly describes the project and its relationship to the theme of the architectural folly. Applicants are encouraged to submit renderings and sketches of the proposed project. The proposal should address plans for the reuse, recycling, dispersal of all material used in the project. Resene colour/s must be used in some aspect or all of the build project, and creative use of colour/s will be part of the judging criteria. Resene colour/s must be standard Resene colour/s on current Resene colour charts. Any paint and or coatings must only be a Resene product. IMPORTANT: Do not include any names of team or identification on this part of entry, as selection is made through a blind judging process. Therefore this will ensure that judges do not know who the applicants are.

Budget:

A detailed budget must be included that identifies all costs including materials and labour.

Also a detailed description of the methodology for prefabrication, transportation and onsite erection and construction and must be included. Please note that the winning team needs to be onsite to supervise the production of any work undertaken, that includes contractors, tradespeople, family etc.




